

From Pastor Richard

Hello, people of God at North Riverdale Lutheran Church!

This is our last update of 2024. What a year! I am celebrating the fact that this year brought me to NRLC. It's an honor to be with you, and I look forward to the good things happening here in 2025. Let me tell you, in case you haven't noticed, that your generosity is making ministry happen inside and outside our church building. I'm confident that your generosity of time, talent, and money will continue in 2025 to make ministry thrive in our little corner of God's kingdom and beyond. It is an honor and privilege to be with you!

To all of you who were able to join the people of New Hope Lutheran Church to worship there last Sunday, THANK YOU! It was great to see so many people there and witness the cordial interaction between people from both congregations. I've got feedback that the people who attended this service and the Thanksgiving service last month at St. John's (downtown) are interested in more interaction with those congregations. We'll see what we can work out!

Don't forget that our outreach to the neighborhood starts the New Year with a joyful event this coming Sunday, January 5th from 1:00 - 3:00 PM, we will be hosting our "Neighborhood Event to Celebrate the New Year!" Lunch will be served at 1:00 PM. There will be fun activities, free school supplies for kids to restock, and free winter hats and gloves. Join us! We hope that a lot of our members will sit down and talk with the people from the neighborhood who come to be with us for this event.

This coming Sunday, we are going to celebrate the Epiphany of Our Lord. The Gospel is **Matthew 2:1-12**, the story of the magi visiting the infant Jesus and his family. <u>Matthew 2:1-12</u> <u>MSG - Scholars from the East - After Jesus - Bible Gateway</u>. The magi believed that the star indicated that the prophesied king of the Judean people had been born. When Herod and the people in Jerusalem heard about it, they were really upset. After all, if a king had been born, it was a threat to the established order and Herod's power. After the visit, the magi were warned in a dream to avoid Herod on the way back home, which is what they did. That's all pretty wild. The passage shows that it is clear from very early on in Jesus' earthly life that he had come for the people of all countries, not just the Judean people. It also shows that there is danger lurking, and we know how the story moves toward the cross, resurrection, and Jesus' ascension. I invite you to take a few moments to reflect on this story before Sunday. I promise that you'll get more out of the service, including the sermon, if you do.

I'll leave you with one final bit of information: Make sure that you put **January 19th** on your calendars for our **Annual Meeting**. The meeting will be held immediately after the 10:30 AM service.

For the month of **January**, we are collecting:


- Shampoo and conditioner for men and women
